Tour Stop 12 Battle of The Big Blue

On Oct. 22, 1864, after the Union line along the Big Blue was flanked. Jackman's Confederate Brigade overran the militia at the Mockbee farm, 78th and Holmes, and drove Jennison's Union Brigade back to the state line. Jennison and Moonlight's Brigades then pushed Jackman back to this area in late afternoon. Thompson's Confedcrate Brigade came up at dusk. Fighting continued until dark when both sides pulled back.

The GAR monument site on Paseo was selected by Wm. S. Shepherd who fought with Moonlight here. Rt. on Paseo rt. on Meyer left on Troost to Forest Illis Cemetery.
