Tour Stop 5 CONFEDERATE POSITION

At 8:30 a.m. Sun., Oct. 23, 1864 Gen. Shelby's Division moved north and struck Union troops near the Wornall house. Gen. Blunt's Union cavalrymen were driven across Brush Creek. Shelby stopped to bring up ammunition. About 3.000 Confederate men were behind a stone fence along 51st St. facing a heavily wooded area to the north. Here their line extended from Oak St. to State Line. From 9:30-10:30 a.m. they came under heavy artillery fire and were forced eventually to pull back to 55th St. East to Wornall: rt. into Loose Park. Donated by Jackson County Historical Society
