



#### Plans Change

The Confederates advanced slowly, stopping for raids and gathering supplies. On September 27, they arrived at Ft. Davidson, south of St. Louis, and attacked. They were repulsed, and, after dark, the outnumbered Union garrison slipped from the fort. Some Southern troops gave chase. Before the Confederates could regroup, St. Louis was alerted. The necessary "moment of surprise" was lost... and also the major objective of the raid.

#### Raiders Turn West

General Price's men turned toward Jefferson City, the state capitol. Enroute, they recruited men, and swept the area of mules, horses, cattle and military supplies. But, at Jefferson City, unexpected Union strength discouraged attack. The army rode on westward, through the river towns, on toward Kansas City and Ft. Leavenworth.
