
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Fierce Resistance in a Delaying Action

Beside the Little Blue River

By October 21, the men in gray had fought through Lexington and were enroute to Independence. At the Lattle Blue River them the present Highway 24 bridget, one brigade of the U.S. Army of the Border prepared to delay the Confederates' advance to the Big Blue River where General Curtie was painting to make his stand.




Federals Entrench

Hoping to "bug Price," he dispatched a trusted messenger to General Pleasonton, arging him to press forward. The messenger, narrowly escaping drowning and capture, got through. By midnight, 15,000 Federals were deployed along the west bank, waiting.
