



Civil War Soldier

This is a 36 foot monument of white bronze (zinc) in an impressive setting at the entrance to Union Cemetery. 167 soldiers are inscribed on the four sides and there are panels of Washington, Lincoln, Grant, and a common soldier. The white bronze has had restoration efforts in the past and looks good. There is a marker indicating that funds were left in an estate to maintain the monument. Union Cemetery is on the NW side of town. From Highway 3, take 19th Street north to the cemetery. The first photo was taken 7/31/10 -the others on 9/16/19.











Civil War Monument

The Civil War Monument was erected in 1885 by the Albert Rowley Post of Grand Army of the Republic (GAR). The unveiling took place that year in front of a large crowd on Memorial Day. It was made of white bronze, which was a popular choice at the time. The height of the marker from the top of the soldier's cap to the ground is 36 feet.

Of the 167 names on the monument, 116 of them are buried in this cemetery. The soldiers listed around the lower edge came from New York, Vermont, Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Minnesota and lowa.
