The building was rededicated on May 25, 2008 after restoration of the second floor and the the front porch/balcony. It serves as a museum with historical displays, military items and artifacts from the region on the first floor. The building has been donated to Dallas County and is operated by the Dallas County Conservation Board. It is believed it was built in the 1880's and served the Marshall GAR Post which met on the upper floor. The SUVCW Grenville Dodge Camp #75 meets here on a periodic basis.
