The Sailor is missing his right hand/wrist; the nautical Spyglass, which the right hand held; the Boatswain Whistle which was

hanging from the chain around his neck, many holes from corrsion, plus his chest was caved in.

The Soldier's musket is missing the trigger guard and trigger. There will be a more in depth inspection once the Soldier is in the

preservationists studio in Newton, IA. The Eagle is another unknown until it can be taken down from its 'perch' and inspected.

- As Elkader, Iowa, is located in the extreme NE corner of the state, all participating fund raising members except one, need to drive many miles and hours to accomplish the task; which they gladly volunteer.
