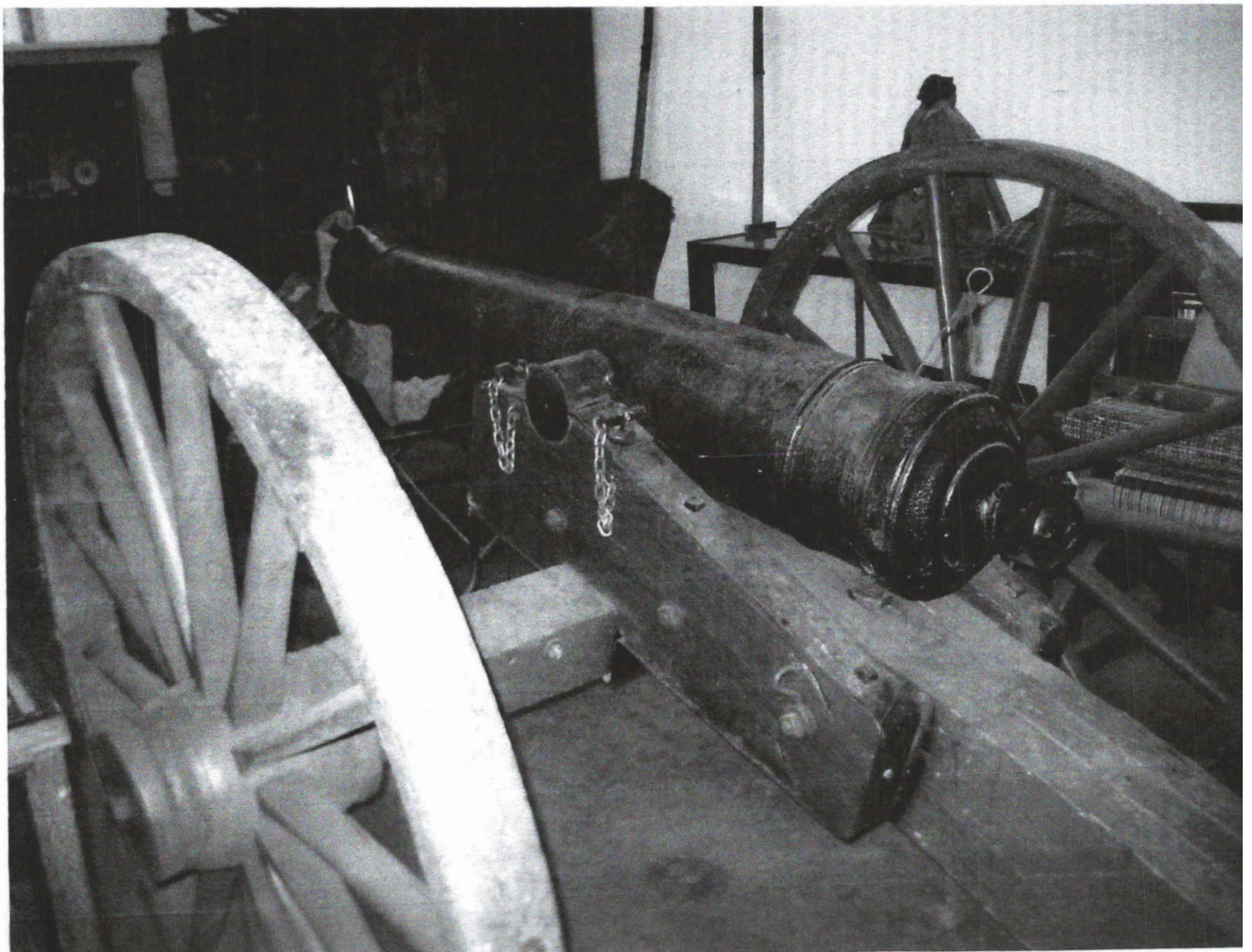

That would put it in the 6 Pdr. range.
It is 65 inches overall. No visible markings.
Trunnions have been replaced with
welded on new ones. No rimbase.
Cascabel has been replaced.
Reported to have been found in Kirksville, Missouri.**

This is believed to be a Confederate cannon located at the Monroe County Historical Museum. It is a cast iron smoothbore cannon with no markings.
