

# Albia Albia Museum

This is a cast iron cannon, believed to be a confederate gun. It is a smooth bore of approximately 3 7/8 inches. That would put it in the 6 Pdr. range. It is 65 inches overall. No visible markings. Trunnions have been replaced with welded on new ones. No rimbase. Cascabel has been replaced. Reported to have been found in Kirksville, Missouri.
