Last Soldier Robert Killen Memorial

Robert Killen and William Humphreys were the last two Civil War Soldiers in Lucas County. Both died on January 25, 1941 and both are being recognized as the last soldier. Robert Killen was a member of Company F, 37th Kentucky Infantry Regiment. SUVCW member Mike Rowley led a ceremony on August 23, 2014 to place a plaque at Robert Killen's gravesite at Graceland Cemetery in Otter Creek Township in Lucas County. Two Veterans Die Same Day

CHARITON, IA—Lucas county's last two civil war veterana
were dead Monday, the victims of
sudden illnesses.

They were William Humphreys, 97, of Oakley, Ia., and Robert Killen, also 97, who lived on a farm near Norwood, Ia.

The veterans were former farmers, Mr. Humphreys served in the 119th Obio Infantry, and Mr. Killen served in the 37th Kentucky Infantry.

Funeral services for Mr. Killen were Monday at the Latter Day Saints church south of Lacona, Ia. Rites for Mr. Humphreys are set tentatively for Tuesday afternoon.
