



Civil War Memorial

This is a 20 foot granite shaft with an eagle on top. It is a very nice memorial with other veterans monuments nearby. It was dedicated July 6, 1912. The names of 72 CW Veterans are inscribed on three sides of the monument. It is located in a city park off Highway 18. Photos taken 4/23/08 and 8/30/16.





AMERICAN LEGION

The Earl T. Conaway Post No. 318 was organized with a meeting at the Sanborn Public Library on December 21, 1919. Twenty-Two men were present that evening. The name Conaway Post was selected in honor of Earl Thornton Conaway, Hdgts Co., 168th Regt, Ia. Inf., who was killed at Argonne Forest. October 14, 1918. Earl was among the first volunteers from Sanborn and served with honor to himself and the organization.

March of 1946, the organization decided to build its own legion building. The 40' X 60' structure cost \$5,000.00 and was ready for use in September of 1947. The railroad leased a lot north of the depot to them to build the structure. In the fall of 1948, a fire did much damage to the building which was repaired. During the year of 1998, the American Legion moved to the Saphorn Community Center for their quarters.

Legion moved to the Sanborn Community Center for their quarters.

The purpose of the American Legion is service to the community. The organization is interested in youth and

sends a boy from Sanborn to Boy's State each year.

In 1979, The American Legion purchased the flags for Main Street and in 2003, they restored those flags by supplying new ones with different flagpoles. In 1982, they purchased 29 flags for Memorial Avenue of Flags at Miller Park along with the holders for the flags. The number of flags at the Avenue of flags continues to grow through donation by the community and family members. The Honor Guard was involved in the dedication of the Miller Park in 1982.


AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY

The American Legion Aixiliary to Earl T. Conaway Post No. 318 was organized at the home of Mrs. Cora Bradley in 1920. Nine ladies were present. Although the organization was organized in 1920, the Charter is dated August 3, 1922.

The Auxiliary has been active in civic and patriotic work, being interested cheifly in renabilitation work. The organization assists with Poppy Day and fund a girl from Sanborn to Girl's State. The purpose of the organization is to aid and benefit the veteran and his family and to contribute to the accomplishments of the aims and purposes of The American Legion.

CIVIL WAR MONUMENT

The Veterans Memorial in the Sanborn City Park was erected through the efforts of the Women's Relief Corps and included County Appropriation. It was dedicated on July 6, 1912.
