Last Soldier Benjamin F. Akers

Corporal Benjamin Akers (1842-1941) was the last living soldier of Taylor County. He served in Company A, 22nd Iowa Infantry. On October 14, 2017, members of the SUVCW Kinsman Camp placed a Last Soldier marker and conducted a dedication before a large crowd and many relatives. The photo shows descendants of Corporal Akers.
