I have a short question, but first please read the long introduction:

The remains of 70 19th-Century soldiers buried in what is now downtown Tucson between 1862 - 1878 were uncovered during a construction project. The remains have been studied and old records' researched in an effort to identify as many as possible. 20 of the soldiers were members of the "California Column" that crossed from California to Texas during the Civil War, the remainder are from the Indian War period. On May 15th, 2009, the remains will travel from the research facility in Tucson in an escorted convoy to the Southern Arizona Veterans' Memorial Cemetery in Sierra Vista, where I live. They will be buried on May 16th with full military honors in a special section of the cemetery that is surrounded by a stone and wrought-iron inclosure. To cover the cost of the wall, individuals can buy an inscribed 4x8-inch brick for \$100; organizations can purchase an inscribed 8x8 brick for \$500.

Question: As the Memorial Grant Committee Chairman, do you consider the purchase of an 8x8 brick to fall within the purviews of the SUVCW's Civil War Memorial/Monument Fund?

Since I am already involved in this project, I would make sure that the SUVCW brick was located in the walkway adjacent to the Civil War Union soldier's graves.

Bro. Schall,

My question regarding the "memorial brick" was a bit premature. When I spoke to the Cemetery Administrator, Mr. Joe Larson, about placing a memorial brick in the walkway next to the Civil War soldiers' graves, he responded by suggesting we install a plaque or marker on a stand or support next to the walkway. I returned the next day with a draft for a 24x18-inch stone marker, which he approved, and today (17th) I received a 'ball-park" estimate from a stone engraver of \$200. This is less than the cost of a brick! The marker would be installed next to the graves of the 14 'California Column' Civil War soldiers who died while on active duty. All the soldiers are to receive the correct up-right government headstones.

The soldiers were discovered in an old military cemetery found during a construction project in Tucson. The other 56 graves will contain 53 Indian War soldiers and 3 Indian Scouts. All 70 soldiers are to be interred en masse on Saturday, May 16th, 2009, in a separate historical "19th-Century veterans' cemetery". This historical cemetery will eventually be surrounded by a low stone wall topped with a wrought-iron fence. There will be a flag-pole and a monument with the names of the soldiers whose individual remains could not be identified. Plans are to fly a 36-star or 37-star flag over this cemetery. There will be space remaining in this cemetery in the event the remains of any other 19th-Century soldiers are found.

Veterans' and Heritage Groups are encouraged to send representatives or color guards (psssst! The SCV is sending one!!!). There is also an open call for any and all CW and Indian War reenactors. I have extended an invitation to the SUVCW's Arizona-at-Large Picacho Peak Camp in Phoenix. I have organized a small group of old reenactors (and veterans) to portray the color guard of the Burnside Post, G.A.R.

I learned of the reinternment project while researching the Burnside Post, G.A.R., Tombstone, Arizona. I completed a survey of the G.A.R. monument that stands in the Tombstone Cemetery and submitted it to Bro. Tucker, the National CW Memorials Officer. The monument is in excellent condition, but the cemetery records are in shambles. I have identified with certainty two unmarked graves and have found nine other GAR members who were buried in the GAR section that remain "unlocated" because no supporting documents can be found identifying their exact plot—several of which are unmarked. This may call for another plaque, listing the names of these veterans, that can be installed near the present G.A.R. monument. Please have Brothers with any information on Burnside Post, Tombstone, Arizona, forward the same to me.

When I return home this evening I will forward all recipients a photo of the Tombstone G.A.R. monument and the draft for the cemetery plaque.

Arizona GAR Posts

Brother Schall,

Nagley Post was No. 1, the first GAR Post organized in Arizona Territory, sometime in 1881. Burnside Post was No. 2 and received its charter in late 1881, very shortly after Gen. Burnside's death, hence its name. The GAR's Arizona Department was merged with CA/NEV Dept. in the 1890's when Arizona's membership declined and the Posts were assigned new CA/NEV Dept. numbers, this is why I did not include the numbers on the plaque. I have no information as to when the post's closed. Where did you get the years for Nagley? Perhaps 1897 was when it became part of the CA/NEV Dept.?

I gleaned this information from the SUVCW's GAR webpage and the Library of Congress' GAR website. As far as I know, there is no history of the Burnside Post. Tombstone had two fires and when the mines played out the town's population plummeted. I have not researched Nagley, but I did find some pictures of the post's members in the Arizona Historical Society's collection while researching Burnside Post.

I designed the marker not only as a memorial to the California Column soldiers, but also as a memorial to Tucson's Nagley Post (where the remains were discovered) and Tombstone's Burnside Post (the post closest to the new cemetery and site of a GAR monument). That is also why I used "A.T." (Arizona Territory) instead of today's "AZ". Perhaps it would be a good idea to add the initial post numbers and the years the posts existed, if this can be determined before the 16th of May.

I am currently compiling a list of all known Burnside Post members from newspaper articles and obituaries that appeared in the Tombstone 'Epitaph' and 'Prospector' from the years 1881 until 1910. Almost 5,000 editions of the two papers have been scanned and are TEXT SEARCHABLE, but I can only access them at the Univ. of AZ Library's main reading room in Tucson, so this will take some time...


