EAST BRIDGEWATER.

Dedication of the Soldiers' Monument.—The monument erected by the citizens of East Bridgewater, in honor of the soldiers and sailors of that town who were killed in the war, was dedicated, yesterday. A description of the structure, with a list of the names of the dead thus commemorated, appeared in The Globe of yesterday. The order of proceedings was substantially according to the programme then announced. In the forenoon, the severel posts of the Grand Army present assembled near the monument, where an address of welcome was delivered by Comrade G. A. Wheeler. Other addresses were made by General Joseph H. Barnes, Colonel John Morrissey, Comrade Charles Howland of McPherson Post, and others. Afterwards, a collation was served at the Town Hall.

In the afternoon, a procession was formed in the following order: L. F. Gammons, chief marshal, and aids, Robert O. Harris and F. C. Nutter; Martland's Band; J. Dimick Post, No. 124, of East Bridgewater, C. E. Edson, commander; Fletcher Webster Post, No. 13, of Boston, Nelson Ross, commander; Gilcher's Band; McPherson Post, No. 73, of Abington, B. S. Atwood, commander; Plymouth Band; Camp Collinwood Post, No. 76, of Plymouth, S. C. Phinney, commander; Bowles's Band; David A. Russell Post, No. 78, of South Abington, Major Charles H. Allen, The exercises of dedication were commander. in the fellowing order: Voluntary by Martland's Band; assembly called to order by Dr. Asa Millett, President of the day; prayer by the Rev. W. F. Farrington; singing by a large choir of gentlemen and ladies, who had volunteered their services, the music being conducted in excellent style by Mr. L. W. Richards and accompanied by Martland's Band: reading of letters, expressing regret at inability to be present, from E. D. Robinson, Esq., and Colonel S. P. Richmond. formerly of the Third Massachusetts Regiment; address in presentation of the monument, by W. H. Osborne, Esq.; response by E. S. Whltmarsh, Esq., Chairman of the Town Committee; brief historical address by William Allen, Esq.; address in behalf of the youthful patriots of the town, by Master Charles Keith; oration by the Hon. B. W. Harris, M. C.; closing with singing and the benediction. The address of the town, by Master Charles Keith; oration by the Hon. B. W. Harris, M. C.; closing with singing and the benediction. The address of Mr. Osborne gave the history of the work of erecting the monument, from which it appeared that the cost was \$4439, of which \$556 was contributed by the Soldiers' Aid Society; by subscription, \$1583; by the town, \$2000; by the citizens of Eastville, \$300. Mr. Harris's address was most eloquent, and we regret that we are forced by the pressure of general news upon our columns, this morning, to omit an elaborate sketch of it, which had been prepared.
