MONUMENT DEDICATED.

EXERCISES AT THE DEDICATION OF A SOLDIERS'
MONUMENT AT WEST BRIDGEWATER; THE PROCESSION AND SPEECHES, ETC., ETC.

TAUNTON, MASS., JULY 4.—There was an enthusiastic gathering at the dedication of the Soldiers' Monument at West Bridgewater to-day. Nothing occurred to mar the proceedings, which were completely successful. The princial exercises were held under a mammoth Yale tent. The Grand Army posts of Brockton, East Bridgewater and Easton, the Standish Guards of Plymouth and the Cunningham Rifles of Brockton were present, also the South Easton Fand. Among the invited guests were Judge Russell, Horace Binney Sargent of Boston, Capt. Leonard, Bridgewater. Capt. Charles E. Churchill was Chief Marshal. The procession formed at the church at 10 A. M., and marched to the monument. After an invocation by the Rev. Mr Beaman, an address was made by Architect Thomas Moens of Quincy, delivering the monument to the Committee. A resionse was made by the Committee, and the monument was then delivered to the Selectmen of the town, who accepted it with appropriate remarks, after which followed the reading of the names inscribed on the monument by the President, Rev. D. H. Montgomery. The procession then reformed and marched to the church. Dinner was served at 1 o'clock by Copeland of Boston, William H. Jennings, Eso., officiating as toast-master. The oration was delivered by Horace Binney Sargent, followed by sentiments and responses, with salutations by Judge Russell. Capt. Leonard made a brief address, after which the closing prayer was made by Rev. Mr Rogers. Most of the people were homeward bound before the tempest overtook them. Many residences were handsomely decoated.

The monument consists of seven pieces. The platform is seventeen feet square and has two steps. The bottom base is seven feet square, two and one-half feet thick and weighs ten tons. Resting upon the bottom base is a very handsome polished die, four feet square, five feet high and weighing 5 tons. Over the die is a cap and then a plinth on which rests a fluted column thirteen and a half feet high, surmounted by a cap on which rests the American eagle, holding the stars and stripes. The height of the whole monument is 35 feet, weighs 36 tons without the platform and cost nearly \$3500. Flags, cannons and anchors and a laurel wreath are among the ornamental emblems. The names of the fallen soldiers and other suitable inscriptions are placed on the monument. On the north side are two panels, the upper one containing the following inscription in raised letters: "Erected by the citizens of this town in memory of her sons who lost their lives in defending the Government during the war of 1861-65." Beneath this is a smaller panel, in either lower cerner of which is a projecting olive leaf which surrounds on two sides the inscription: "Let us have peace, 1879." On the east side are cut in sunken letters the following names of West Bridgewater's fallen soldiers: Capt. John Ripley, Myron E. Alger, Timothy Cullahan, Edgar E. Calwell, Melvin Calwell, Martin Cunningham, William Dewyre, John B. Dunbar, Henry H. Folsom, John B. Gould, Charles H. Hayden, Lyman E. Hayward, Eustace Howard and Nicholas P. Howard. On the south side the die is plain. On the west side are the following names: Leonard Jones, Hector O. Kingman, Wesley D. Lindsey, Francis Lothrop, Michael McMurphy, John Mullen, Charles H. Parker, James M. Pasco, Henry Quimby, Asa F. Shaw, James M. Stetson, Roscoe Turner, Elijah Withington and James E. Jacobs.
















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
