

Brewster is commander, but the dedicatory excercises proper were under the direction of D. A. Russell post, G. A. R. of which A. D. Hutchison is the commander. The energetic work of the sons of veterans has made it possible for the monument to be dedicated with every bill paid.

The monument occupies a site near the genter of Whitman park, on an elevation which is surrounded by small shade trees. It is 25 feet high and has a broad base of Quincy granite. The marble block is a beautiful shade, and on the front are the words. "In Memory of our Soldiers and Sailors, 1861—1855."

It is surmounted with a broaze figure of a scout, trailing arms. The broaze figure is 7 feet in hight.
