# Somerset County Boys Who Died for Their Country.

After the Soldiers' Monument was dedicated it was found that a large number of names of Somerset county soldiers who were killed in battle or who died during their term of service were not reported to the committee, and, as a matter of course, their names do not appear on the monument. Since that time much labor has been expended in trying to collect these missing names, and so far additional names to the number of one hundred and ten have been reported. It having been determined to have the shaft of the monument recast and these names placed thereon, a last effort is being made to secure the names of every Somerset county soldier who was killed or who died during the war for the Union.

By request we print the names of all that are now on the monument, and also a list of the names collected since. Our readers are earnestly requested to scan both these lists closely, and if they notice the absence of any name from either list that should have a place thereon, they will please report the same without delay to A. C. Davis, of Somerset, Pa., who will have it placed on the list, which must be completed by the 3d of August next.

Please note.—The only names wanted are those of soldiers who were killed in the war or who died of disease during their term of service—not having been discharged.

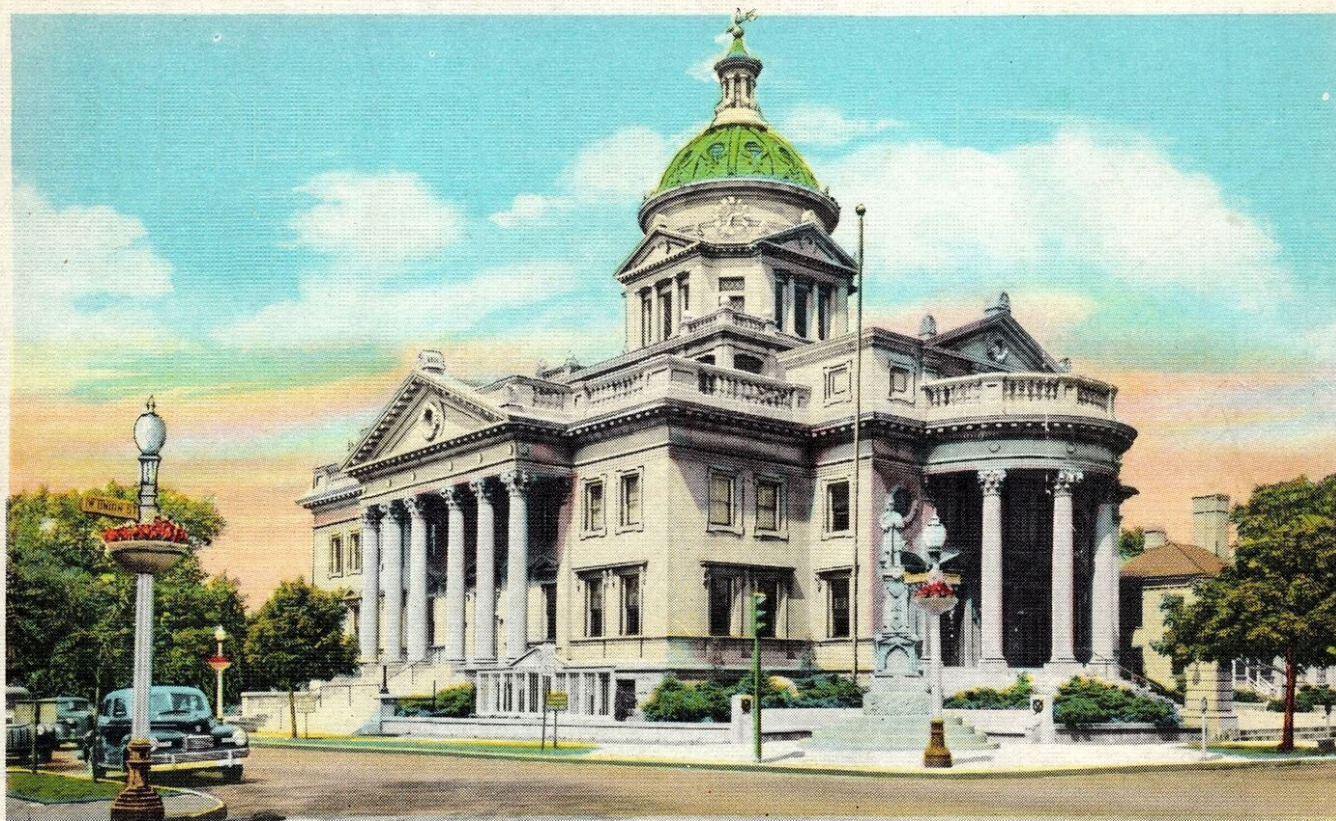
