He was held as a prisoner of war at Camp Sumpter at Andersonville, Georgia, and remained a prisoner until the end of the war. Additionally, I have a supplemental registration for my great, great uncle Francis Xavier Albert, 10th Maine Infantry, Co. D.

I am the Past Department Commander of Massachusetts and am also a member of the Governor Elisha Dyer Camp No. 7, Department of Rhode Island, and the Major General Thomas J.
