Share in Holi-
day.**

Despite the early rain many members of the G. A. R., Spanish-American War Veterans, U. C. V., as well as other citizens visited the cemeteries Wednesday morning and placed flowers and flags on the graves of the soldiers. This began the observance of Decoration day in Tulsa. No services in the cemeteries were planned for Wednesday afternoon, but the parade and program in Convention hall were expected to surpass any patriotic celebration ever staged in the city. Though the city has been decked in flags and streamers for some weeks, additional red, white and blue streamers were brought out for the day, and not only homes and business houses, but automobiles and trucks bore the gay colors.

A platoon of mounted police commanded by Chief Lucas was to lead the procession planned to formulate on Main street at 1:30 Wednesday afternoon. Capt. A. J. Niles was deputized as chief marshal. With his staff, he was to follow the police. Mayor Simmons and the city officials; officials from the Chamber of Commerce; boy scouts in uniform; G. A. R.; Confederate Veterans and auxiliaries in automobiles; Spanish-American war veterans; army, navy and Oklahoma National guard recruiting parties in automobiles; Oklahoma ambulance company No. 1; floats representing the entente allies, Red Cross, Navy league; National League for Woman's Service, U. D. C., and other patriotic organizations; the Jovians; Kendall students; labor organizations; engineering company; Tulsa school children; fire department and citizens were to appear in parade.

The procession was scheduled to march north on Main street and on to Convention hall, where the program was to start at 2:30, with the following numbers:

- Music by band, "Hail Columbia."
- Call to order by the chairman.
- Invocation by Rev. L. S. Barton.
- Song by entire audience, "Columbia, the Gem of the Ocean."
- Organ Recital, Professor Weaver.
- Patriotic address by A. A. Small.
- Song by audience, "The Star Spangled Banner."
- Address by P. H. Maroney.
- Song by audience, "America."
- Closing, dedication of monument to the unknown dead by G. A. R. post and auxiliaries.
