It is believed that the statue was purchased 1910/1911 from the Monumental Bronze Company of Bridgeport, Connecticut.

In 2001 the storm damaged statue was repaired by a local autobody shop and after repairs the statue was painted gold.

The statue underwent extensive repair and restoration in 2025 at a cost of \$6,000. The work was completed by the Conservation Lab of Vancouver, Washington with conservator Jason Jones overseeing the work. The monument was relocated away from the large fir tree that had damaged the statue due to storm falling limbs.

The Baker Camp SUVCW donated \$250 and has applied for a grant from the national SUVCW as well.

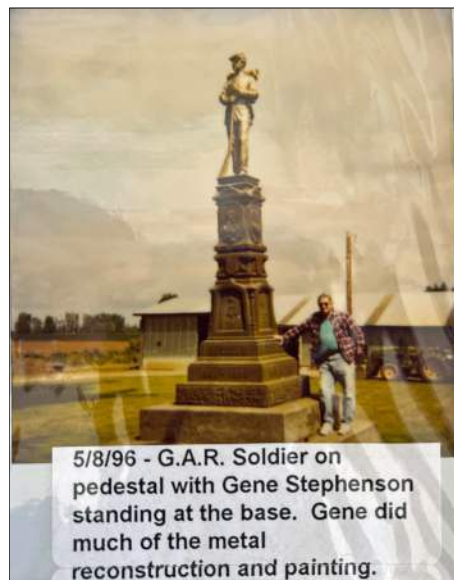
OTIS NEEDS SOME HELP

The soldier atop the GAR monument in Woodburn, Oregon's Belle Passi Cemetery has been nicknamed Otis by the cemetery staff. The name was inspired by the Otis Redding song Dock of the Bay which was playing on the radio as staff worked on the restoration of the statue.

The GAR memorial was originally placed in the cemetery in 1911 by the Isaac Stevens Post 51 of the WRC. In the 1990s the statue was damaged in a windstorm and underwent restoration in 1996 by a local auto body repair shop owned by a member of the American Legion. At that time the statue, which is made of zinc, was painted gold.

The statue stood guard again from 1996 to 2023 when another windstorm broke off the limb of a large fir tree which struck the head of the statue. Otis has since been removed from his pedestal, the gold paint removed, and he has been shipped to a sculpture restoration company in Vancouver, Washington. The cost to repair the statue is \$6,000. Additional funds will be raised to move the monument to a section of the cemetery where there are no trees.

The Col. Edward D. Baker Camp No. 6 humbly requests grant assistance to get Otis back on duty guarding the graves of the seventy-one Union Civil War Veterans buried in Belle Passi Cemetery.

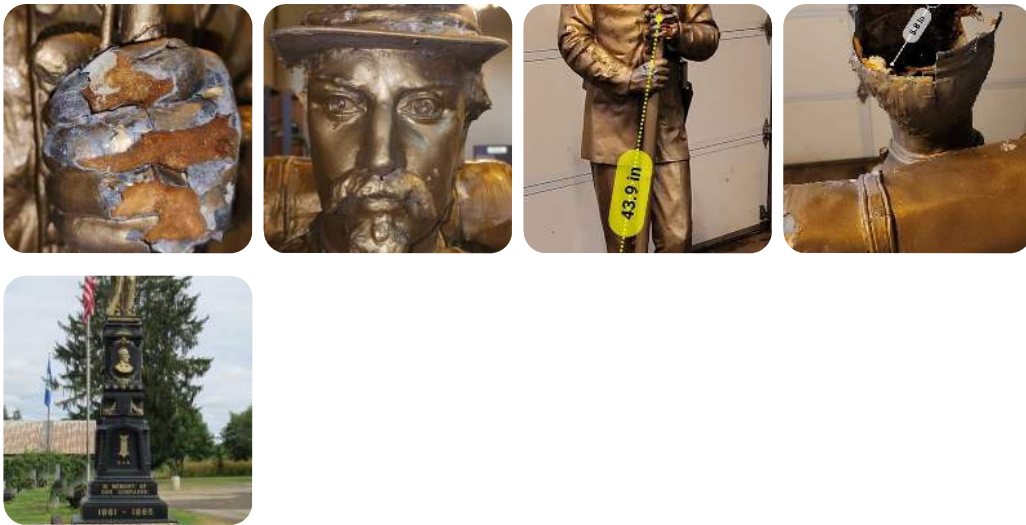


This fundraising campaign seeks to restore the historic Civil War memorial statue that has stood vigil over our pioneer cemetery for more than a century. In 2020, a large tree branch, brought down by freezing rain, damaged the soldier's head and hand. The statue, made of zinc a popular material at the time for its lightness and affordability was removed in 2023 with plans to repair it. However, finding a professional skilled in zinc restoration proved challenging. Recently, we've located a studio capable of performing the necessary work! The cost to repair and remount the statue is estimated at \$10,000.

We invite the community to help us bring our soldier back to his rightful place, so he can continue his watch over the cemetery. Join us in this effort.

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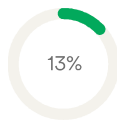
